

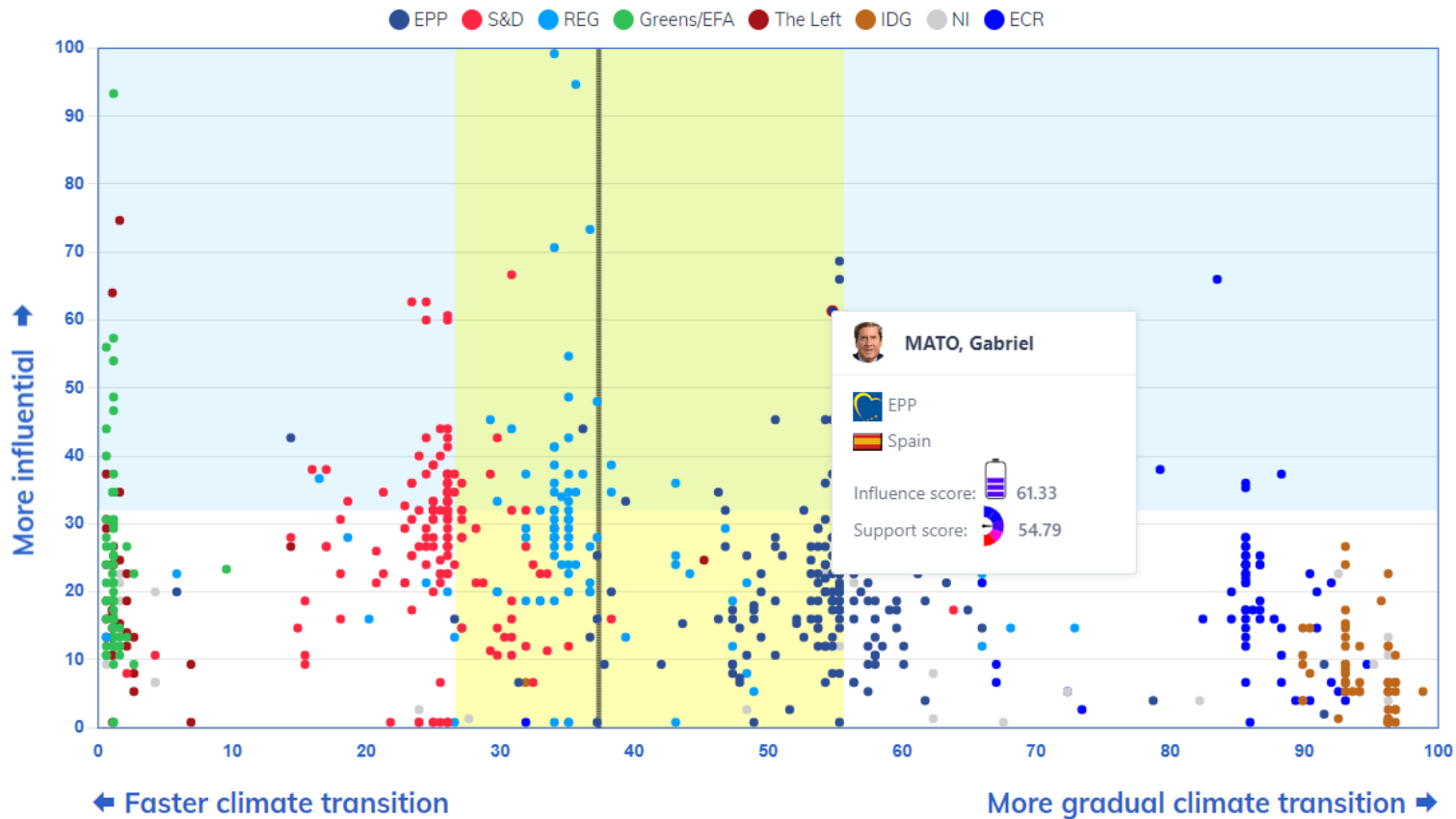

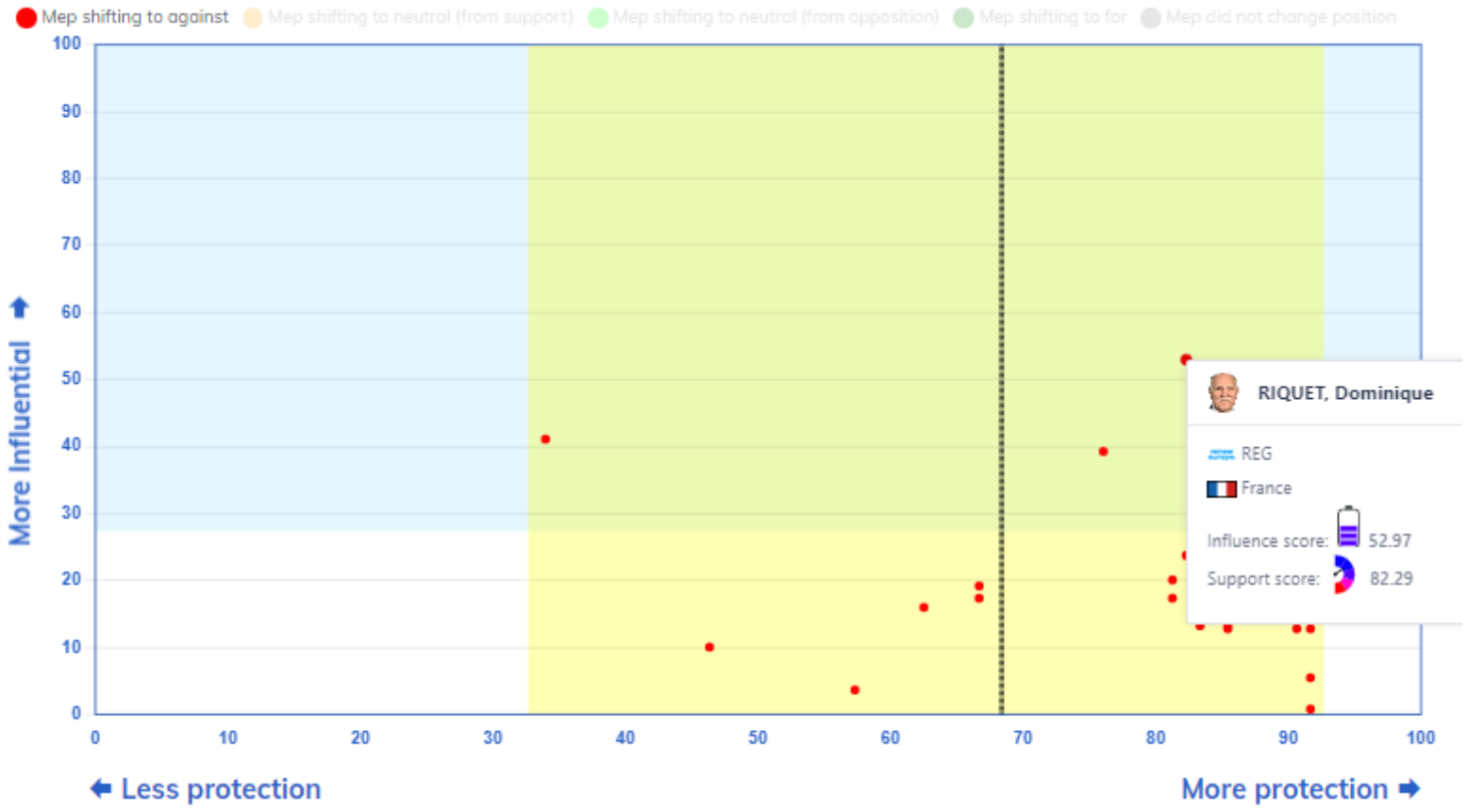

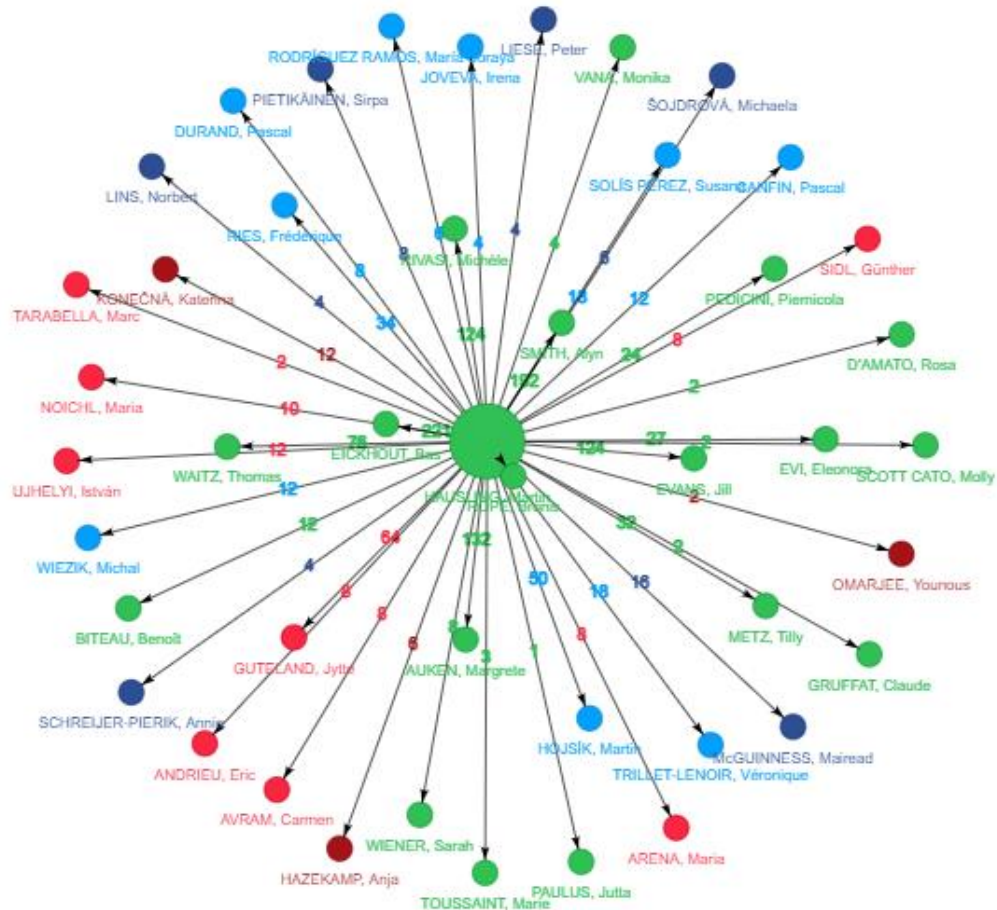

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- The network of an MEP allows you to quickly assess if an MEP is an influence hub and how you can reach more MEPs;
- Tip: The more politically diverse the network of an MEP is, the higher the chances that he/she can pass their amendments.
- Some MEPs are unable to find cosignatories for their amendments outside of their own political group !
- Tip: when a rapporteur does not have a strong and diversified network established already, that's a sign of "trouble", it is an indicator that the rapporteur will have a hard time to pass his/her views and that other MEPs could take over the process.

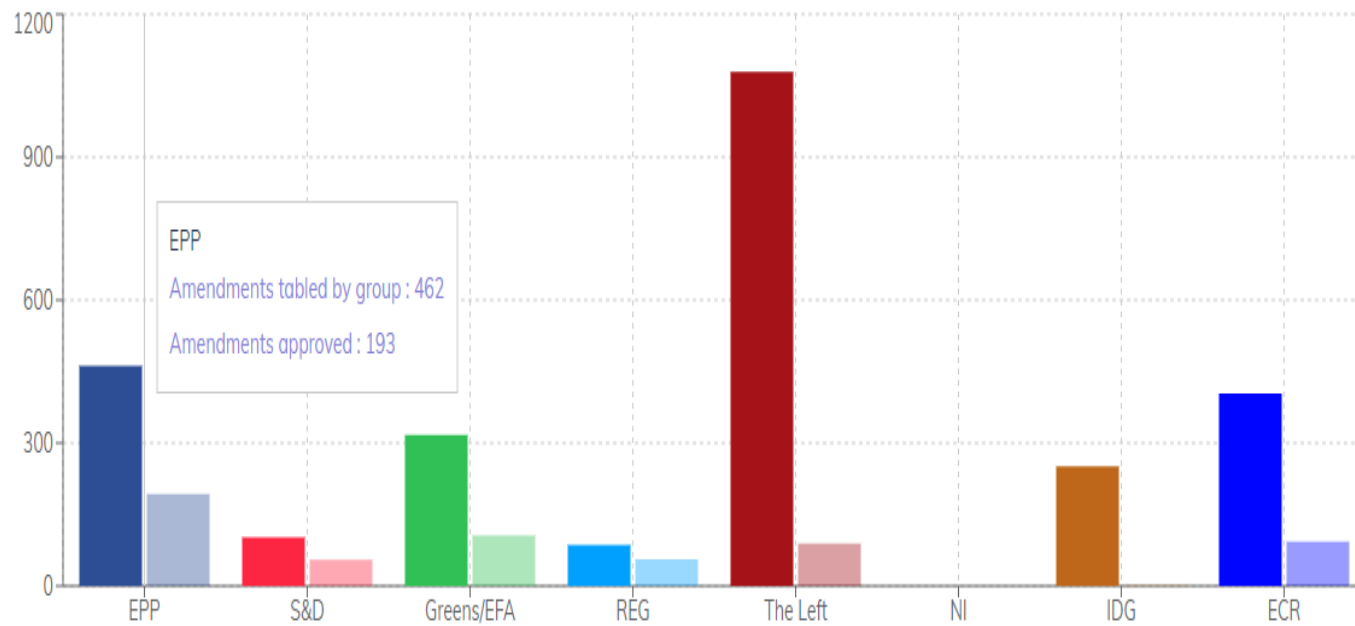

Rate of successful amendments by political group

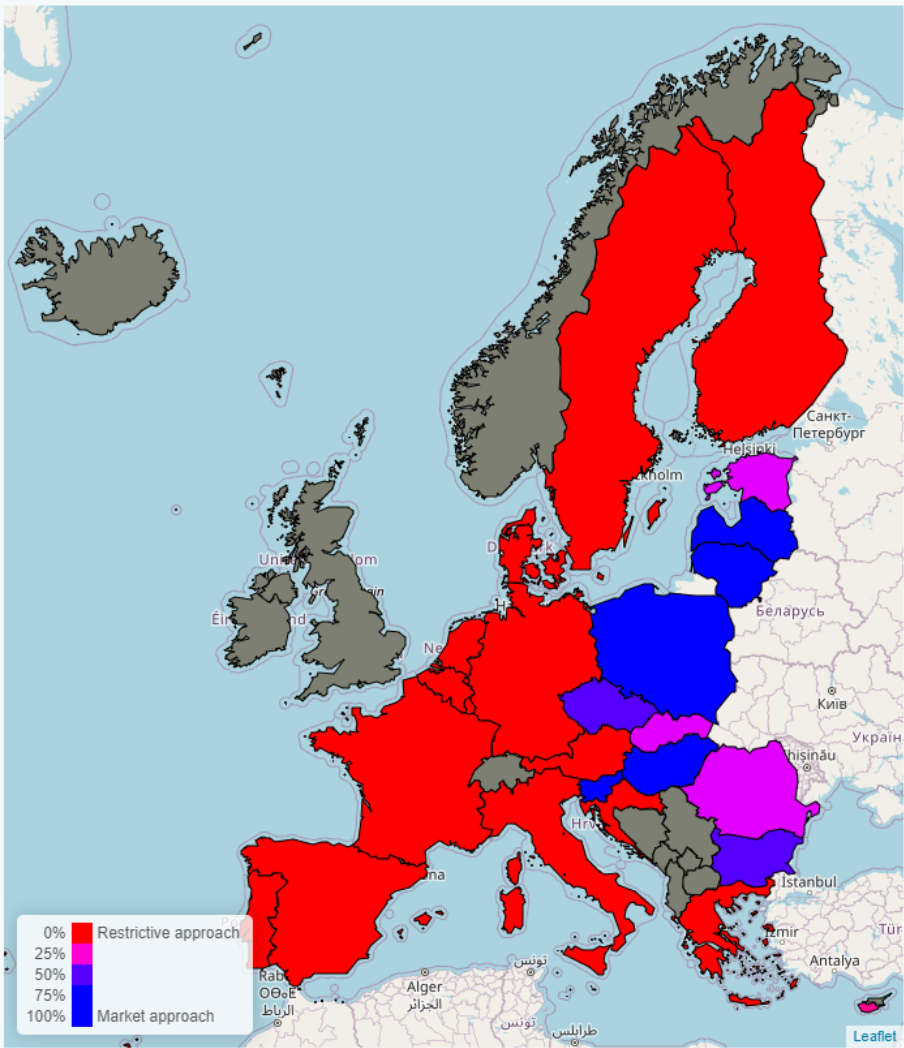

➤ We measure if the position of the government is solid and stable. We track if there is tension/disagreement between the parties that make up the governing coalition;

➤ The position of the parties in opposition is also relevant in case a change of government is getting close or the government is vulnerable / has little political capital to spend “at home”;

Additional features:

- Section on the EU elections 2024 is coming up, which will track the likely impact per each policy (by factoring in the projected sizes of each national party in May 2024 and the voting track record of each party);
- We are following the national political arenas to track the formation of the positions of the governments before they “arrive” to Brussels;
- We can add new sources of data upon request, such your own assessments;
